#### A LENTEN MESSAGE FROM PASTOR TOM

Dear Friends in Christ,

With an early date for Easter, Lent sneaks up on us quickly this year. Named after an old English word for springtime, this sacred season stretches from Ash Wednesday through Holy Week, and nudges believers to be more intentional about the practices that nurture spiritual growth. The excerpt below, taken from traditional Presbyterian liturgy, describes a delicate balance it seeks to maintain between taking on and letting go:

"I invite you, therefore, in the name of Christ, to observe a holy Lent by self-examination and penitence, by prayer and fasting, by works of love, and by meditating on God's word."

I expect we will find these Lenten themes to be especially pertinent as we look both inward and onward as a congregation, grateful for God's persistent faithfulness and mindful of God's persuasive call to love our neighbor as ourselves. Prayer as a Spiritual Practice
Sunday, March 17, 11:15 a.m., Halldorson Hall

The time of Lent is approaching when Christians traditionally renew a focus on their inner life and relationship with God. One of the spiritual disciplines that help us to do this is **daily prayer.** On Sunday, March 17, 2024 we will have an opportunity to think more

about how daily prayer fits into our lives. Rev. Mary Anne Collins-Stauffer will offer a Faith Forward presentation that morning after worship to discuss the practice of daily prayer, especially as it is presented in the book "Celtic Prayers from Iona." This book was written by J. Philip Newell during the time he led the religious community of Iona Abbey in the western isles of Scotland. Everyone will receive a copy of the book to take home.

Mary Anne was born in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, but she grew up in Switzerland, with her Swiss father and American mother. She returned to the U.S. for college, graduating from Duke University and then Princeton Theological Seminary. She joined the Navy and she was ordained by the National Capital Presbytery to ministry as a United States Navy Chaplain. Mary Anne served on active duty as a Hospital Chaplain, on the Chief of Chaplain's Staff, and in the Navy Reserves. Because her family moved frequently, she has led worship, preached, and provided pastoral care for congregations of PC(USA) churches in Wisconsin, Washington, D.C., Hawaii, California, Utah, West Virginia, and Virginia. In recent years she received an M.S. in Clinical Mental Health Counseling from Loyola University Maryland and worked at the Pastoral Counseling Center of Fort Meade Army Base outside Washington, D.C. She is licensed as a counselor (LPAC) in the State of New Jersey.

# The Rev. Dr. Edward M. Halldorson, Pastor Emeritus Preaching Palm Sunday, March 24 at 10 am

Rev. Halldorson served as pastor of PCCT for 30 years during a time of great community growth and change. The fourth Senior Pastor of PCCT, Rev. Halldorson is the longest-serving minister in the church's over 60-year history. He was given the title Pastor Emeritus when he retired in January 2019.

Born and raised on Long Island, Ed was ordained at his home church, Christ's First Presbyterian Church in Hempstead, New York in 1974. Ed graduated from Lafayette College with an BA in History in 1971. He received a Masters of Divinity degree from Princeton Theology Seminary in 1974. He served as the Associate Pastor of the Penfield Presbyterian Church near Rochester, New York from 1974-78. From 1978-88, Ed was the Senior Pastor of First United Church, Silver Creek, New York, before accepting the call to Chatham Township. In 1999 he received a Doctor of Ministry degree from Princeton Theological Seminary with his thesis on the Atonement: "What Language Shall I Borrow: How Laypeople Interpret the Cross".

Rev. Caroline S. Unzaga is the Manager of Spiritual Care at Morristown Medical Center, where she leads a multi-faith staff of chaplains who serve the spiritual and religious needs of patients, families and staff of the 800+ bed hospital.
